CHAC Annual General Meeting 2007 PRESIDENTS REPORT

FUTURE EXHIBITIONS AND PROJECTS

1. Promotional Package to solicit exhibitions.

We realized that to solicit exhibitions in public galleries we needed to have a professional **Promotional DVD.** Thus, we are most thankful to **Miklos Rogan** who with the input of the Board created a package that we can be proud of.

It include information on CHAC artists, their CV's, artist statements and images. It also has information on our organization's history and mandate. It lists CHAC's numerous past projects and committees. Curators have praised this package. We hope that all of you will help us get exhibitions by contacting your venues. Please ask us to send you this package so that you can help us to solicit future CHAC exhibitions.

- 2. Shows in Ontario: Andrew and Judie Benyei have contacted venues in Toronto and we will be following up on their work. Geza Hermann is investigating the Peterborough Art Gallery.
- 3. Show in Hungary in Szentendre: Anna Torma & Istvan Zsako had met with the director curator, who is a personal friend of hers and he has emailed her a date for a CHAC show in 2008. The board and Anna Torma will have to analyze whether the date given allows us enough time to raise the necessary funds and do justice to such a serious major project or whether we should ask for the show to be shifted to a later date. We will soon announce the call for artists. This will be a curated show, asking artists to present material that has not been presented in previous applications. We feel that the Rogan DVD played an important role in introducing us to HE Pal Vastagh the Ambassador of Hungary, and in convincing the representatives of the Hungarian Foreign Ministry that CHAC artists merit international exposure in the country of their origin. When we receive the official letters we will forward you all the details. We are also very fortunate that

both Istvan Zsako and Anna Torma have been lobbying for us in Hungary. We have contacted a curator here who in principle agreed. **Please note that anyone who directly contacts the gallery will be eliminated from the call for artists.**

4. Fund Raiser "A" Silent Auction of Art work Montreal: Susan Dobbek and the Board are investigating the best time and location to hold such an event.

Fund Raiser "B" April Livia Budai accepted to present us her memoires, with a performance and exhibit of her performances. In cooperation with MHHS

Fund Raiser "C" For High Donors An intimate gourmet supper with music of **Vic Vogel** & Whitehall wines (to be elaborated) supper to follow screening of Vogel Film

Fund Raiser "D" Yard Sale at Julia Ciamarra's Fund Raiser "E" Mailing to High Profile Successful Hungarians across Canada for sponsorship of Hungary Exhibit.

- **5.** Exhibition-Fundraiser in Ottawa: CHEF's Judy Young has in principle agreed on a collaborative exhibition & Fund Raiser in Ottawa. We will discuss specifics with her when she returns from her travels.
- **6.** Stewart Hall Canadian-Hungarian Video and Filmmakers and Performance artists. Under Discussion with Joyce Millar who is very interested in this project that I proposed to her.

PAST PROJECTS SINCE THE LAST AGM

1. Pier 21 Museum CHAC Exhibition

The CHAC Exhibition "Reflections Canada-Hungary" traveled to Halifax. CHAC was hosted by the Pier 21 Board and Executives at a major Banquet. The exhibition was impressive and we are proud to be part of all the Pier 21 exhibitions that commemorated the 50th anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution. I recommend that all should once in their lifetime visit this museum

that is dedicated to telling the story of immigrants.

2. MHHS EXHIBIT CITY HALL

Montreal Mayor Tremblay responded to the CHAC request to hold a major event that celebrates the 50th Anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution, as Hungarians had come here in large numbers CHAC was offered this exhibition at City Hall and asked to organize an exhibit that would tell the story of Hungarians and Hungarian associations in Montreal. I concluded that this was a project that went beyond the mandate of CHAC. Thus, not wishing to lose this great offer to honor Hungarians, I spearheaded the creation of "MHHS", by gathering together many leaders in Montreal, to create the "Montreal Hungarian Historical Society" under the Co- Presidencies of Maria Mailath and Christopher Adam.

With an almost impossible deadline 2 months away, and in the summer months, when people are away vacationing, \$10,000 was raised and an exhibition was mounted. Of course, all would have wished for more time to do a better more comprehensive research. But, considering the realities, I am amazed that the MHHS group was able to do this and that CHAC was an important player in this project, providing manpower and artistic expertise. Again, **Miklos Rogan** did all the artwork for the exhibits.

3. The 2007 Tantramar Art Symposium

This project was a year in the making with over 800 hours of volunteer work. It attracted artists and Participants from all over Canada, the US and had a good Acadian NB presence. As Compared to 2005, the number of participants increased to almost 90 (including the venue people). An incredible sense of camaraderie pervaded the symposium.

The Program consisted of:

1. 8 workshops during the day, led by: Gabor Szilasi Photography, Tamas Wormser Film& Video, Printmaking with Judith Klugerman, In Situ Constructions with Geza Hermann, Fiber Arts with Danielle Ouellete, Clay molds constructions with Ghita Levin,

Photoshop with David Zsako B, Multimedia Painting with Found Objects by Andrea Blanar

- 2. A 5 day Hungarian Canadian Film Festival, Films By Tamas Wormser, Attila Bertalan, Peter Horvath, Sophie Fekete and Istvan Kantor.
- 3. A top quality exhibition of our workshop leaders and speakers curated by Doreen Lindsay
- 4. Evening conferences, Included Nova Scotia Fiber Artists **Deanne Fitzpatrick**, Emeritus Psychiatrist, **Dr Jacques Drouin** and Children's Book Reading By **Tom Kapas.**
- 5. An Awesome MultiMedia Performance by **Istvan Kantor & family**, winner of the Governor General's award in visual arts, whose echos are still resonating in Sackville area.
- 6. **Wormser & student** produced a Highly popular Short Film on the Devastating Effects of the Confederation Bridge on the Cape Tormentine Community. This film has been circulating in the area and was featured at a recent arts Festival at Cape Jourimain.
- 7. There were numerous socials, a welcoming breakfast, a guided Tour by **Chris Blanar** Water Biologist of the venues and of the natural and historical sites, a lobster supper a welcome and a goodbye supper.

All in all, this area of NB are still talking about the CHAC Symposium and "the Hungarians" and pressuring us to make this into an annual event. With the exception of several anonymous donors and CHEF donation, we mostly self financed this project thanks to all our artists who were willing to donate their time or receive very little for their work. On Behalf of CHAC I thank all who came and all who worked and were workshop leaders. I thank Doreen for being at Struts every day. I thank Sophie for filming non stop and all of you for the generosity you provided in car pooling and helping out.

Symposium 2009?

Istvan Kantor has offered to direct and produce a mega performance that unites all symposium workshops and participants. He feels that he, with the help of experts like, Wormser Tamas, Hermann Geza and

Kapas Tom, can orchestrate such a mega happening. The Board will study this project and determine whether we can do another symposium. We will need a major influx of funds, and fees will have to increase at least to cover the expenses and per diem of our workshop leaders. So we will revisit this project and re-assess the possibility of doing another Symposium. Kantor says that we are first to look for a script that would allow all workshops to take part and also leave room for creative improvisation. Send in your ideas!

OTHER SUCCESSES

- 1. **Our professional Artists:** We continue to find top quality Canadian-Hungarian Artists. We will be enlarging our categories sphere to include filmmakers, music and literary artists. This will, we hope, stimulate more multimedia interactions and collaborative projects
- 2. **Our Program**: **Julia Ciamarra** continues to provide us an interesting and fun program during the year. She will be sending in her program summary for the year
- 3. **Support System:** All of us continue to use CHAC as a wonderful support system and a professional networking system.
- 4. **Newsletter: Rózsa Dancs**, a professional magazine editor accepted to do our newsletter and produces very lengthy comprehensive reviews of all our activities. Sophie Fekete and Mary Ebos continue to review artists' exhibitions and interview our artist members.
- 5. Archives: Our newsletters are now published and preserved in Ottawa National Library Archives and also Széchenyi National Library Archives in Budapest.
- 6. **Partnerships:** CHAC has formed a partnership with **CHEF** (Canadian Hungarian Educational Foundation) CHAC activities are now on the CHEF website and this relationship allow us to raise funds for educational projects and issue tax receipts. CHEF has also assisted us financially with the 2007 Symposium.

We continue our alliance with MHHS in the shar-

ing of manpower and in organizing an interesting educational program.

We collaborated with **HCEA** in their sugaring party and mobilized our members to support and attend that event and we look forward to increasing such collaborations.

Montreal Hungarian Newspaper "Magyar Kronika", continues to assist us and our artists by covering all CHAC events and CHAC artist exhibitions.. We are presently in discussions with other Hungarian organizations so that we can collaborate on mutually beneficial projects.

- 7. **Website:** After along period of inactivity due to a manpower crisis, our web site is finally in the hands of our top notch artists **Victor Kapas and Susan Dobbek.**
- 8. Our website is now linked with the new **Kalejodszkop.com** website.

SET BACKS & FAILURES

- 1. Constant Lack of manpower:
- 2. Lack of Funds
- 3. Inability to get the Ontario artist to mobilize a social or professional agenda and the inability to find volunteer manpower in the Toronto area.
- 4. A difficulty in recruiting new manpower here threatens the organization as members are in danger of burn out.
- 5. We need more volunteers or we must reassess what we do or cut back our sphere of activities.
- 6. Recent shortage of manpower left our web site unattended for too long.

Danger to Hungarian institutions in Montreal: When looking for partners and in discussions with other Hungarian Montreal organizations, it is evident that many of these organizations are threatened by the inability and unwillingness of the younger generations to work as volunteers. The Volunteer base is ageing and in some cases people are mostly in their 60's with the majority in their 70's and many in their their eighties.





ANDREA BLANAR'S EXHIBITION

A few days ago the Galerie d'Arts Contemorains presented an exhibition of Andrea Blanar's latest work at 2140 Crescent street. The exhibition is on from 18th of October to 31st of October. The gallery is situated on the unofficial hub of "latest trends" in Art. It is walking distance from the Museum of Fine Arts

Descending a few steps from the street, entering the gallery, one enters another world of the mysterious silence of New Brunswick marshes. The paintings are mostly landscapes. The theme of the artworks are landscapes enriched by a suggestion of magic are the locale of Adrea's studio at the maritimes. The formats of the pictures are subtly innovative; the rectangular format of the tableaux are extended beyond frontal plane of the pictures onto its sides, lifting it out of the wall surface. It guarantees its being a slice of reality not just a window opening. There is a suggestion of other worldliness in the other formats presented pictures that are shaped like gothic arches of church windows framing a view of the marshes with swaying rushes rendered with loving care. While a few paintings are in the conventional format others presented in a playful mode, inviting the viewer to contemplate on many levels of concepts offered. Also there are a few truly imaginative pieces of ex-furniture granted a new sphere of existence by enshrouding in a landscape - thus (almost) becoming an icon to be worshipped.

All pieces of art presented are witness to the technical excellence of the artist in the various kind of art; either in two or three dimensions.

Andrea Blanar is an artist of notable achievements; She had, up to date, 31 solo shows, in group exhibitions in Canada, USA, China recipient of a number of awards. A lecturer at our three universities in Montreal and above all the founder and guiding spirit of CHAC.


