SUMMARY

The column entitled "Studies, Articles, Data" starts with Gy. KRISTO's study: "Hanenburch = Hakasd?" A record of a journey by an anonymous author in the llth century makes an attempt at the identification of Fungarian place-names. KRISTO tries to prove that the datum Hanenburch in the itinerary is identical with Kakasd, in County Tolna, of today. - C. REUTER's paper presents the data of a puzzling Hungarian place-name: Nöbölgyuk. Though no elucidation of the name is given, its Turkish origin is suspected. - A. MEZO deals with the place-name: Agasegyháza. He refuses the origin of the anterior constituent being derived from a personal name (Agas~Akos), and tries to verify that the name originally referred to such a church, whose roofing was supported by pillars ("ágas" in Hungarian), columns sunk in the ground. - Mrs. M. MÉSZÁROS-VARGA presents in her article entitled "Sarvaly" a combination of the diachronic and synchronic research of place-names. By means of the present place-names she locates the boundary of the long-desolated village Sarvaly, thus explaining the names of the places. --P. FARKAS writes about the stylistic features of the placenames of some settlements in the Jász region. -- M. HAJDÚ's study presents the semantic grouping of the stallion-names in county Békés and demonstrates the spreading of these names in the 20-ies and 30-ies. - L. MIZSER's paper entitled "Animal Names in the works of István Fekete" collects the animal-names from the animal atories of the author. written for the young, stating that they are mainly of

onomatopoetic and imitative character. — Z. DÉGI lists names of dogs, horses and cattle from the village Ordacsehi. — In opposition to the concept of tradicitional grammar, K. FABÓ in her article "Changes in Form-classes: Common and Proper Nouns" proves that the change: common noun—proper noun and proper noun—common noun is not a change in form-classes, but a semantic one.

The "Review" column gives an account of the following works: A. W. Reed, A Dictionary of Maori Place Names; Register of the Public Domain of the County Town Szeged; Sándor Tonk, Transylvanians Attending Foreign Universities in the Middle Age; Linguistic Studies 1980; Zoltán Sárközi and István Sándor (eds.), A Monograph of the town Mezőkövesd; Further Texts from Frigves Pesty's Place-name Register; E. N. Poljakova, From the History of Russian Christian and Family Nemes; Cnomatological Studies Supporting Hungarian-Slavic Linguistic Connections; Ju. M. Kruhljak, The Name of the Place where You Live.

The column "Observer" publishes first a paper by Ferenc Pápai Páriz entitled "On Names". The 17th century author made good observations about the customs of coining names by various peoples. — Peggy and Bözse: nick-names as Christian names. — A newspaper article on the naming of horses. Contradiction in the reports. — A contribution to the history of the family Duba of Hontfüzesgyarmat. — Writers and poets on Christian names and on giving personal names.

The column "Chronicle" offers congratulations to Lajos Lõrincze on the occasion of his 65th bithday. — An account of the 3rd Hungarian Onomatological Conference. — The collection of the place-names of county Komárom is completed.
